Medical Transportation Assistance Program

The Department of Health and Community Services offers reimbursement of a portion of the cost of transportation, accommodations and meals for patients who have to travel to another region of the province or outside the province to access medical service. Patients who have to travel by air also have an option of applying to have 50% of their airfare covered through this program. Patients who travel by private vehicle can get reimbursed for travel exceeding 1,500 kms. As there are specific qualifying criteria for this program, you are urged to consult the nurse in your regional Cancer Centre or the Social Work Department at the Dr. H. Bliss Murphy Cancer Centre. Newfoundland & Labrador Prescription Drug Program

Provides financial assistance in the purchase of eligible prescription medications for those who reside in the province. There are four main plans under the program:

1. A plan for those in receipt of income support benefits through the Department of Advanced Education and Skills.

- 2. A plan for coverage of eligible prescription drugs to residents 65 years of age and older who receive Old Age Security benefits and the Guaranteed Income Supplement.
- 3. A plan for individuals and families with low incomes. The amount of coverage is determined by net income level and family status.
- 4. A plan for individuals and/or families with high drug costs, whether it be from the cost of one extremely high cost drug or the combined cost of different drugs.
