Palliative care services are helpful, not only at end of life, but also at earlier stages in the illness.

Palliative care providers can focus on controlling pain and other symptoms, ensure adequate home support, assist with grief support, and educate and advocate for patients and families as needed. Research has shown that early integration of palliative care can improve a patient's quality of life.

PALLIATIVE CARE SERVICES

Regional Palliative Care Services are part of the Rehabilitation, Continuing Care and Palliative Care Program of Eastern Health.

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Services are available to anyone within the Eastern Health region who has obtained a palliative care referral from their health-care provider. Services include pain and symptom management, as well as grief and bereavement counselling.

INPATIENT SERVICES

The Palliative Care Unit in St. John's is located at the Dr. L. A. Miller Centre (LAMC). This unit has 10 private rooms, two family lounges, a kitchen area and a quiet sacred space. There are also dedicated beds located at the following facilities throughout the region:

COMMUNITY & HOME SERVICES

PARAMEDICS PROVIDING PALLIATIVE CARE PROGRAM

In this program, trained paramedics are able to provide care to patients within their home when they are having an emergency associated with their condition, such as pain or symptom control.

The goal of the program is to support people living with life limiting conditions by providing the care they need at any time, day or night, and to assist them to remain comfortable at home, if this is what they wish, for as long as possible. The program is operational in the St. John's metro, with plans for expansion to other regions in 2021. Please call (709) 777-4605 for information. Paramedics, Community Nurses and Social Workers assist patients in receiving care at home for as long as possible.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Community Support Program provides palliative care services for clients and families at home. Once connected to the program, the client can access services from community health nurses and social workers. This team can help to improve quality of life at home by providing clients and families with needed support, medical equipment, symptom management, and connections to other resources.

HOME & COMMUNITY NURSING PROGRAM

The **Community Supports Program** provides palliative care services in both the home and community clinic setting. Once eligible for palliative care, the individual can access services at home from continuing care nurses and community support social workers who can help provide relief from symptoms such as pain, nausea or stress and improve quality of life.

When an individual has reached the final stages of their life, the **Continuing Care Program** and **Palliative End of Life Care Program** offers additional services to provide comfort and support to the client and their family in their own home. End of life care at home is available across the Central Health region and includes a number of services, such as: Paramedics, Community Nurses and Social Workers assist patients in receiving care at home for as long as possible.

- Home visits
- Symptom treatment
- Medical equipment and supplies
- Personal care for the client
- Household management needs
- Respite for main caregiver
- Medications including home oxygen

PALLIATIVE AND END OF LIFE CARE

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Services are available to anyone within the Western Health region who has obtained a referral to the specialist palliative care team from their health-care provider. Services include pain and symptom management, goals of care discussions, and grief and bereavement.

INPATIENT SERVICES

There is a Palliative Care Unit located at Western Long Term Care Home. It has 15 private rooms, a private family room, sacred space, living room and kitchen, along with a private outdoor garden for both patients and families.

There are also 8 palliative care beds throughout the region:

COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

Palliative Care is provided by the Community Support Program to individuals of any age who are house-bound, and have a life-limiting or life-threatening illness. The focus of palliative care is to address symptoms, and concerns that impact the person's quality of life. It is delivered by a health care team and can include:

- Relief of pain and other symptoms causing discomfort
- Advance care planning/goals of care discussions
- Support for family and informal caregivers
- Support of cultural needs
- Support for emotional, social and spiritual needs
- Counselling and grief support.

Palliative care is not only for the end stage or last days of an illness. People can benefit from a palliative care approach at the diagnosis of a life limiting or life threatening illness.

END OF LIFE AT HOME

End of life care is provided by the Community Support Program to clients within their last eight weeks of life. This service is delivered by an interdisciplinary team and offers symptom management and supportive care, enabling the person to stay at home for as long as possible or to die at home if that is their wish. Services can include:

- Coordination of care by a nurse case manager
- Support and education for the individual and family throughout the dying process
- Home support
- Equipment
- Coverage for the cost of approved medications

LONG TERM CARE

Labrador-Grenfell Health offers a range of longterm care services, including regional assessment and placement, recreational therapy, planning and direction for long term care beds in St. Anthony, Happy Valley – Goose Bay, Labrador City and Forteau.

Program responsibilities include the single point entry admission process, and monitoring and licensing of personal care homes operating within the region.

In selected locations, social work and physiotherapy services are offered through qualified professionals.

ADDITIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES

MAID - Medical Assistance in Dying

Medical assistance in dying became legal in June 2016 and is governed under federal law. It is the administering by a doctor or nurse practitioner of a substance to a patient, at their request, that causes their death or, the prescribing or provision by a doctor or nurse practitioner of a substance to a patient, at their request, so that they may selfadminister the substance and in doing so cause their own death.

Although MAID is not offered by the palliative care team, it can be part of end of life discussions. A patient can request information about MAID from any member of their health care team. A referral to the palliative care team is not needed for a patient who is interest in having a discussion surrounding MAID.
